Annual Report 2014 - 2015



Message from the Director:

The Manitoba Education Research Network (MERN) began in 2004 as an initiative within government. In 2012-13, the network moved outside of government supported by an annual grant from Manitoba Education and Advanced Learning with financial administration by the Manitoba School Improvement Program and office space provided by the Faculty of Education, University of Winnipeg. MERN now operates with the capacity to represent education research interests on the part of all its associates in the education field.

As an informal network organization, MERN depends on in kind contributions from five education faculties and twelve affiliate education partners. These contributions from network members are highly significant particularly as the interest and support for MERN increases over time. In 2014-2015, MERN delivered annual activities and added other events related to education research groups and publishing initiatives. Some highlights:

- The MERN Teacher Education Research Group (TERG) hosted a fall 2014 seminar
 that featured a session by Dr. Jim Parsons, University of Alberta. MERN has
 established a relationship with the Canadian Journal for Teacher Research (CJfTR)
 edited by Dr. Parsons. Larry Petkau, River East Transcona School Division, had his
 article on work with the MERN Grade Twelve Inquiry Project (GTIP) published in this
 national journal.
- The MERN Indigenous Education Research Group (IERG) used a "bear-pit" format for the MERN Treaties and Reconciliation Winter 2014 Education Research Seminar. This event brought people together to meet and share lunch at the Manitoba Metis Federation location in Winnipeg. Several IERG papers have been published as part of the MERN Occasional Papers Series: Indigenous Education.
- A new MERN Leadership Education Research Group (LERG) is in early stages of development with a fall 2015 seminar planned.
- An article titled "The Manitoba Education Research Network: Teacher Research to Enhance Equity and Engagement in Education" was published in the March 2015 issue of Canada Education.

In addition to its many face-to-face events, technology applications support a range of MERN initiatives. The University of Winnipeg provides videoconference access for Winnipeg-based faculties of education to Brandon University and University College of the North. Frontier School Division (FSD) continues to support MERN teleconferencing and hosts the MERN Winter Forum that has become an annual live streamed event with the FSD technology department connecting sites across the province.

I am pleased to provide this annual report for 2014 – 2015 on behalf of the Manitoba Education Research Network.

1. Preface

The Manitoba Education Research Network supports research events and activities related to schools and schooling in Manitoba. Now in its tenth year of operation, the network has an established program of Manitoba-based research events and activities. These core functions are sustained on an annual basis while additional MERN initiatives are developed in response to evolving priorities, leadership directions and expanding knowledge base in the field.


4. Responsibilities

MERN financial information appears in the 2014 – 2015 Manitoba School Improvement Audited Financial Statement tabled at the MSIP AGM, November 2015.

MERN has received a \$123,000 annual operating grant from Manitoba Education and Advanced Learning beginning in 2012-2013. This amount has been reduced to \$93,000 (-25%) for 2015- 2016. Dear Dr. Farthing

On February 6, 2015, MERN affiliate organizations met to consider the recently announced reduction in MERN operating support for the 2015-2016 fiscal year. As education stakeholder associations that have worked collaboratively with faculties of education over the past decade to build this very successful research network that MERN has become, we are deeply concerned about the implications of this reduction in provincial funding support for this organization.

In the current educational context, there are few structures or incentives that support local education research. MERN, as both an organization and a program, is a notable and highly successful exception in this regard. Built from an initial concept with only modest staffing resources, MERN has evolved into a multi-partnered research network which regularly brings together education practitioners, stakeholder organizations, education faculties and senior ministry staff to address pressing public education issues in Manitoba schools. MERN fora and seminars attract several hundred participants each year and provide a venue for sharing valuable knowledge and information about policies, practices and challenges in our provincial public education system. These events, open to all at no charge, are financed through in-kind supports and services from MERN affiliate members and post-secondary faculties – planning, facilities, food services, technology resources and supports, facilitation services, presenter costs, administrative support.

Likewise, MERN publications are financed through in-kind supports from education partners – research, writing, editing, printing, art work, website design and maintenance, etc. In short, Manitoba's education stakeholder organizations and post-secondary institutions have invested heavily in building the MERN program and understanding well the challenges in coordinating and executing, multi-partnered initiatives as MERN does, we are concerned that the announced reduction in provincial funding support will necessitate a significant scaling back in terms of the program components that MERN can provide in the 2015-2016 fiscal year.

This said, we appreciate the financial challenges facing Manitoba's provincial government and the pressure which this can exert on individual departmental budgets. While we accept that the 2015-2016 reduction in provincial funding for MERN may not be reversible in the short term, we would respectfully request that Manitoba Education and Advanced Learning reconsider this matter with a view to restoring full funding to MERN for the 2016-2017 fiscal year.
